It might be the children - generous, welcoming and warm-hearted, with the courage and fortitude with which these people face their future. It might be the harsh beauty of a city that is continually changing or the indescribable magic of a street market. It might be the constant adrenaline and the crazy traffic jams. It might be all of these things. Kampala gets under your skin and intoxicates you. It makes you feel as if colors are brighter, experiences more vivid, relationships more intense. By comparison, life elsewhere seems to be just a faint, muted parody, especially when you are attempting to organize something that involves so many people.



This is the background in which Hiccup Circus Uganda is taking its first steps... with all its stops and starts, always rethinking strategies, a challenge that keeps us occupied almost all of our time.





... Philosophy apart, after four months of preparation, on 9<sup>th</sup> February ISP in Africa hosted the vernissage (preview) of Hiccup Circus Uganda and since then many things have happened.

March  $16^{th}$  first ever HCU show at Muyenga High School.

March 19<sup>th</sup> HCU incorporated as a Not for Profit Company Limited by Guarantee.

March 26<sup>th</sup> permission letter received from Kampala Capital City Authority to stage circus shows in KCCA public schools.

March 27<sup>th</sup> release of HCU newsletter zero.

April 16<sup>th</sup> memorandum of understanding signed with Uganda Red Cross Society.

May 31<sup>st</sup> article appeared in Africa Rivista Dei Padri Bianchi.

June 2<sup>nd</sup> HCU performed mini show for children at the Italian Ambassador's Residence on National Italian Day.

June 10<sup>th</sup> PayPal account opened.

June 17<sup>th</sup> upgrade of HCU's first web site.

July 3<sup>rd</sup> Ayal - HCU's first volunteer - arrived in Uganda.

July 9<sup>th</sup> foundation of Kasikonda Youth Circus.

July  $19^{\text{th}}\,\text{HCU}$  Tax Identification Number issued.

July 22<sup>nd</sup> HCU joined Facebook.

July  $31^{\rm st}$  HCU show and 2 educational workshops staged at MCAFS Youth Centre.

September 19<sup>th</sup> major upgrade of HCU's web site. October 6<sup>th</sup> show at Kids of Africa charity Run for Fun









To organize and keep alive these activities takes a team of about 25 people - mostly Ugandans. Distance and communication may sometimes be an issue but commitment never is.



One of the most important achievements was the arrival of Ayal Prouser - HCU's first ever volunteer and a specialized trainer in juggling and acrobatics. Not only is he a great coach and friend but he's also an amazing person with a huge heart. In six weeks of hard work, Ayal was able to start-from scratch - a circus arts training program for children to teach other children: the Kasikonda Youth Circus.



KYC's aim is to help Uganda's youth develop their creativity, through training, production and distribution of the arts. The arts act as an incubator for motivated and talented young people in need, and as a network for other groups in raising the potential of performing arts in Uganda to be used as tools for social development. We believe this strategy will help improve the portrayal of children in the media. Additionally, the Kasikonda Youth Circus School helps young people become more engaged in what they are

doing, increases their self-confidence and improves their morale... from being a "can't do" to a "can do" person. It is very important to discover those special talents and abilities the youth have. Giving children a chance to do a variety of activities - especially extracurricular - gives those that don't succeed in formal education a chance to perform better. At the same time, they are helping other young people develop their skills, self-confidence and positive attitude towards life.
